Beyond John 3:16PASTOR JIM

I believe most people in our nation have heard of and

could recite at least in part John 3:16, which reads, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." But, how many oth-



er 3:16's in the Bible are people familiar with? Probably not many people, if any at all, have ever read or know of these other 3:16's. There are numerous other 3:16's which also contain significant instruction for the faithful. The instruction in these verses includes topics like the necessity for proper use of Scripture, the need to encourage others, how God remembers those who revere and fear Him, the means of Baptism Jesus will use, as well as numerous other topics.

The four 3:16's I prayerfully selected for May's sermons are Joel 3:16, which speaks to God as a place of refuge in the midst of judgment; Acts 3:16, which addresses the power of faith in Jesus; 2 Timothy 3:16, which expresses the truth that all Scripture is inspired by God and how it can be used; and Colossians 3:16, which admonishes Believers to let Christ's words dwell in them so they become thankful and encouraging to each other in psalms and hymns.

Now you may be wondering: "Why is it necessary for me to hear about these other 3:16's?" It is necessary, no, it is essential for all of us to hear sermons on these other 3:16's in an effort to demonstrate to everyone there is more to Scripture than a few well known Bible verses. Are those well known verses important? Yes, of course they

are important; but, they are not the totality of important verses contained in Scripture. As 2 Timothy 3:16 reminds those who read it, "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness." If this is true, and I know that it is (since I have lived the truth of these words in my own life I no longer just believe, I know), then even the obscure, difficult, and confusing passages of Scripture have something to teach us. The real question is, "Are we going to listen to what the Lord God is saying or are we going to listen to what the world is saying?" The answer for me is the same as it was for Joshua when he spoke to Israel as they prepared to cross the Jordan River:

"Now, therefore, fear the LORD and serve Him in sincerity and truth; and put away the gods which your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. If it is disagreeable in your sight to serve the LORD, choose for yourselves today whom you will serve: whether the gods which your fathers served which were beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD." (Joshua 24:14-15)

In our lives we have served many other gods. Now it is time to put all those idols away, confess, repent, and return wholeheartedly to the Lord God Almighty. I am very excited to preach this series of sermons for a variety of reasons—



even more excited than normal. I ask each of you to pray each week about our worship services. Specifically, I want you to pray God will speak to each person and God will grant us a revival of faith, trust, service, and commitment to Jesus.
